- Proven capacity to develop innovative research in the chosen field(s) of expertise
- Proven capacity to work in synergy with various fields in the social sciences and the humanities
- Mastery of French, English, Biblical Hebrew and Biblical Greek (any other pertinent language(s) for the field of Biblical studies being an asset).
- Strong publication record in the field of Biblical Studies
- Experience in teaching at a university level, using new pedagogical technologies (online platform(s), long-distance education, etc.) being an asset.
